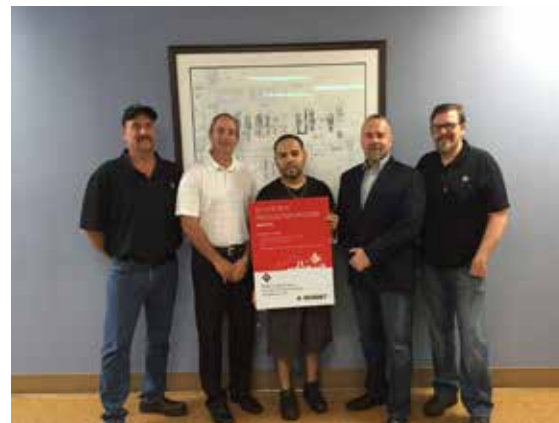

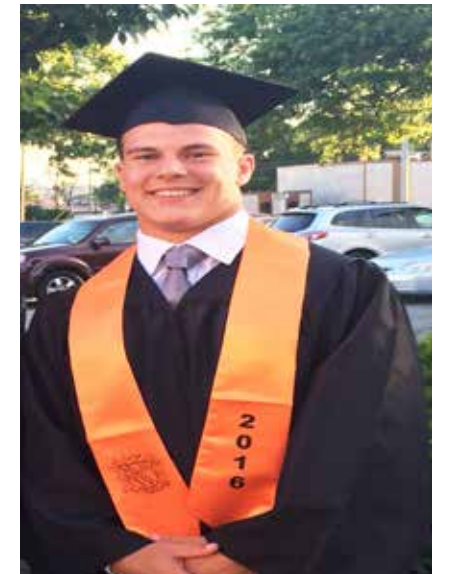

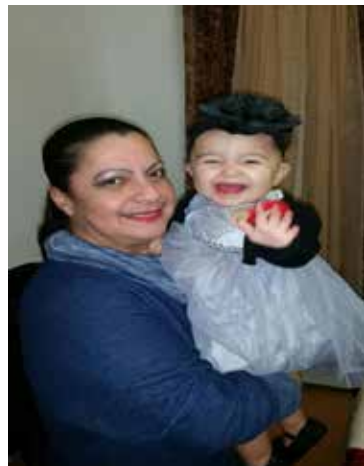

illnesses, but a company-wide examination of such things as the company's overall safety program, ownership commitment, the company's safety practices and training procedures, safety awareness methods and incentives, maintenance programs and housekeeping, and other key elements of box plant safety.

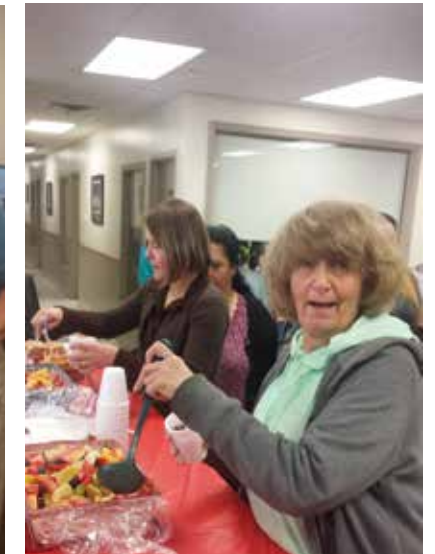

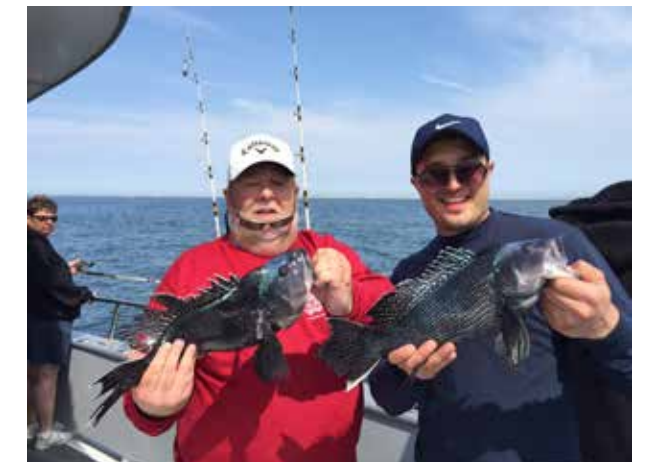
